At 6:00pm, Mayor Kenneth Usry called the regularly scheduled City Council meeting to order and City Attorney Plunkett gave the invocation, which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States flag.

CITIZEN INPUT:

Paul Daly spoke of his concerns regarding impact fees, utility billing and City network security.

Randall Reese spoke of his concerns regarding garbage collection and fire/police departments.

Douglas Veer spoke of the need for, and his willingness to pay for, recycling.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

The motion was made by Councilmember Belton and seconded by Councilmember Johnson to approve the agenda as written. A vote of 5-0 in favor was taken.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Council Meeting, January 13, 2022. A motion was made by Councilmember Johnson and seconded by Councilmember Corley to approve the minutes. A vote of 5-0 in favor was taken.

BUSINESS:

- a. <u>Chuck Cumber 20 Year Service Award:</u> Mayor Usry noted that Chuck is responsible for both of the City's Water Treatment plants and provides us with good, clean drinking water each day. He was presented a certificate and honorarium.
- b. Ordinance 578 Repeal of City Ordinances Related to Fire Service: Mayor Usry presented the second reading of the ordinance. An intergovernmental agreement with the County was approved on August 6, 2019, and is slated to end on August 31, 2044. Ordinance 578 repeals any fire department related obligations in previous City ordinances. A motion to approve was made by Councilmember Smalley and seconded by Councilmember Whittle. A 5-0 vote in favor was taken.
- c. Resolution 02-2022: The City has applied through the Georgia Department of Transportation for a \$59,000 grant of American Rescue Plan Act funds for the Airport. The resolution allows the Mayor and staff to execute the documents to accept the grant. There are no matching funds required. A motion was made by Councilmember Smalley to approve the resolution and was seconded by Councilmember Corley. A vote of 5-0 in favor was taken.
- d. <u>City/County/Forward McDuffie Public Relations Officer</u>: A need is being explored for a professional to, at a minimum, handle all social media and write positive articles promoting the entire county. A job description has been crafted and 50% of the undecided salary would be funded by the County, with the remaining 50% coming from Thomson, Dearing, Tourism, Industrial Development, Economic Development and possibly the Board of Education. A motion to proceed with exploring the possible position was made by Councilmember Corley and seconded by Councilmember Smalley. Councilmember Belton questioned that it is a non-funded position. A vote taken, passed the motion 4-0, with Councilmember Belton abstaining.
- e. <u>Natural Gas Ready-to-Serve Fees:</u> Approximately seventy-five commercial gas customers are considered as low use, with many only connected to serve their emergency generators. The only time gas moves through their meter is during a power outage. Reducing their RTS fee to \$50.00 monthly will result in a City revenue loss of \$14,175.00. The loss would be offset by raising the RTS fee on large use industrial customers. A motion made by Councilmember

Whittle and seconded by Councilmember Belton to approve the changes was passed with a 5-0 vote.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

Council Report:

Councilmember Smalley noted the large meeting attendance and addressed the good points of the City/County Fire Department consolidation. Councilmember Belton brought attention to the street sign missing at Old Washington Road and Cobbham Road. Councilmember Smalley noted that the street sign at Dixie Lock & Safe needs to be checked also. Councilmember Whittle commended the workers who are keeping up with the extra yard trash of recent storms and the cleaning of drainage ditches around town.

<u>City Administrator Report</u>: CA Waller was absent due to a Board meeting of Georgia City-County Management Association.

Mayor Report: Mayor Usry reminded the Council that reservations need to be made for the Chamber of Commerce banquet on March 4th. He reminded all of the community wide cleanup from March 28th to April 1st before the Masters Tournament. After limited or no attendance during the COVID pandemic, the Augusta National is back to normal ticket sales this year and we look forward to having the patrons in our restaurants and hotels again. The City is still waiting to be notified of the award of any of the \$24,000,000 ARPA fund request. Grants of approximately \$10,000,000 are being explored concerning the Railroad Street water park and amphitheater, Journal Street upgrades and First Avenue storm water issues.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: None.

Having no other public business, the motion to adjourn was made by Councilmember Belton and seconded by Councilmember Whittle to adjourn. A 5-0 vote ended the meeting at 6:40pm.

RESOLUTION 03-2022

CITY OF THOMSON, GEORGIA OPPOSING HB 1093 AND SB 494 AND OPPOSING LIMITATIONS ON A CITY'S AUTHORITY TO MAKE HOUSING, LAND USE AND ZONING DECISIONS WITHIN A LOCAL GOVERNMENT'S GEOGRAPHICAL BOUNDARIES

WHEREAS, the Thomson City Council ("Council") has reviewed HB 1093 and SB 494 ("Bills"), currently being considered in the Georgia General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, the Bills would prohibit local governments from addressing newly developed corporate rental subdivisions through any regulation, restriction or condition that is not the same for single-family residential areas; and

WHEREAS, the Bills are aimed at allowing unlimited access for corporations to develop "build to rent" subdivisions which vary greatly in price, quality, management and tenant protections; and

WHEREAS, the Council opposes the Bills for a number of reasons, including the fact that the Georgia Constitution recognizes zoning and land use decisions are core functions of local governments, and housing is a large component of those decisions; and

WHEREAS, local elected officials are responsible for ensuring affordable, predictable housing options within their respective communities; and

WHEREAS, such housing and land use decisions are best made at the local level through comprehensive planning and citizen input; and

WHEREAS, to ensure vibrant and sustainable communities, local governments require flexibility to decide what is appropriate for their community's neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, home ownership is a financial asset that historically has been affordable to all economic levels; and

WHEREAS, rising costs in construction, land and materials are pushing the reality of home ownership further from the reach of more and more Americans, particularly young families; and

WHEREAS, home ownership and the growing equity value it provides is a source of capital for families to start businesses, send children to college, build retirement nest eggs, provide financial resources during financial emergencies, offer an asset to provide services such as assisted living or nursing care or cover a myriad of other financial and economic resources to weather life challenges; and

WHEREAS, these and other benefits are why preserving opportunities for homeownership has long been a high priority of public policy in the United States; and

WHEREAS, good public policy requires a balance of housing options to meet individual needs; however, the Bills remove local decision making from the type and mix of housing available; and

WHEREAS, the superiority of local determination of the type of housing available in a community is one reason why local governmental control of zoning and land use is enshrined in Georgia's State Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the removal of local oversight and the negating of local policy goals inherent in the Bills allows outside forces to determine the type of housing available in a community with no need to work with existing community stakeholders wishing to have a voice in the process; and

WHEREAS, protecting property rights is an important component of good public policy, but good public policy also takes into consideration the property rights, property values and the neighborhood characteristics that purchasers relied on when investing their lifesavings in their current home;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE City Council of Thomson, Georgia, that this governing body hereby objects to and opposes any legislation or act limiting a local government's authority to make land-use and zoning decisions within its geographical boundaries; and

BE IT FURTHER HEREBY RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be delivered to each member of the Georgia House of Representatives and Senate representing the City of Thomson, and made available for distribution to the public and the press.

ORDINANCE OF THE GOVERNING COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF THOMSON, GEORGIA ENACTING PROVISIONS FOR OUTSIDE CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES INSIDE THE CITY LIMITS OF THOMSON FOR CERTAIN DESIGNATED EVENTS, WITHIN CERTAIN DESIGNATED BOUNDRIES, WITHIN CERTAIN DESIGNATED TIMES, AND USE OF CERTAIN DESIGNATED CONTAINERS, AND FOR SUCH OTHER PURPOSES AS MAY BE CONTAINED HEREIN; TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND TO REPEAL ANY CONFLICTING ORDINANCES.

THIS ORDINANCE adopted by the City Council of Thomson, Georgia (the "Council").

WHEREAS, under current ordinances of the City of Thomson the consumption of alcohol is prohibited outside of the selling establishment; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to enact certain provisions of the City of Thomson Code of Ordinances to allow for consumption of alcoholic beverages outside of the selling establishments for specific events and to regulate the sale of same; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to regulate the area of the City of Thomson wherein consumption of alcoholic beverage may take place, the containers used by sellers for outdoor consumption, and to limit the number of containers to be sold at one time by the sellers;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council, and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same as follows:

Section 1. Repeal of current Section 3-17 and replacement.

- 1. Section 3-17 of the Code of City Ordinances of Thomson is hereby repealed in its entirety and replaced by the following:
- "Sec. 3-17. Outside Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages.
- 1. Prohibition of outdoor consumption of alcoholic beverages.
- (a) It is prohibited for customers to leave the premises with open alcoholic beverages, and it is the licensee's responsibility to ensure that no open beverages are sold and carried out;
- (b) It is prohibited for customers to gather outside an alcoholic beverage establishment and consume alcoholic beverages;

- (c) It is prohibited for the manager or any employee to allow persons to gather outside an alcoholic beverage establishment and consume alcoholic beverages.
 - 2. Allowance of outdoor consumption of alcoholic beverages.

Paragraph 1 of this ordinance shall not apply in the following instances:

- (a) For events that are sponsored or organized by the City of Thomson or McDuffie County where the alcohol is obtained from a participating business within any city designated area, and is contained in and consumed from an approved, clear plastic container.
- (b) Where the city council through a resolution has permitted otherwise.
- (c) For restaurants that have obtained a valid sidewalk café permit from the McDuffie County Planning Commission and provided that all outdoor activities are contained within the permitted sidewalk café area.
- (d) Beverages for consumption at a publicly owned or privately owned golf course.
- (e) When a temporary limited license has been issued, provided that the person consuming or possessing an alcoholic beverage remains on the licensed premises.
- (f) For a downtown dining district as defined by this chapter.
- (g) Downtown dining district—outside consumption of alcoholic beverages permitted.
 - (1) For the purposes of this chapter only, a downtown dining district is defined as follows: a specifically authorized and pedestrian oriented area of the city as established by resolution of mayor and council that allows those establishments with a valid alcohol license within such area to dispense and/or serve an alcoholic beverage for carry out purposes, provided all other laws, rules and ordinances are followed.
 - (2) Within a downtown dining district, any establishment licensed to sell alcoholic beverages by the drink for consumption on the premises is authorized to dispense an alcoholic beverage in a clear plastic cup; provided, however, that no person shall remove more than two (2) such alcoholic beverages from the licensed premises at a time.
 - (3) Within a downtown dining district, no unsealed container in which an alcoholic beverage is carried and consumed shall exceed sixteen (16) fluid ounces in size.
 - (4) It shall be unlawful within a downtown dining district for any person to drink, attempt to drink or possess any alcoholic beverage in an unsealed can, glass or metal container, on the streets, sidewalks, rights-of-way, and/or parking lots, whether public or private. This section shall not prohibit the possession of containers of alcoholic beverages with unbroken seals.
 - (5) No alcoholic beverage purchased pursuant to this provision may be consumed outside of the downtown dining district, or upon any private property, without the express consent of the private property owners.

(6) Unless authorized by mayor and council in the resolution creating the downtown dining district, no alcoholic beverage purchased within the downtown dining district pursuant to this provision shall be consumed within the downtown dining district on the streets, sidewalks, rights-of-way, and/or parking lots, whether public or private, prior to 12:00 p.m. or later than 12:00 a.m."

<u>Section 2. Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances previously adopted by the City Council of Thomson, Georgia which are in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent necessary to eliminate such conflict.


